

Niloofar Kakhi's *Nationalism in the Architecture of Modern Iran* charts the fascinating and contested history of the development of a national architectural identity in Iran across the 20th century, and on into the creative turbulence of international architecture today.

Beginning with a discussion of Iranian architecture in the late Kajar period, up to 1925, and during its successor, the Pahlavi dynasty, Kakhi describes the establishment of the Iranian Society of National Heritage, and the first steps toward the foundation of an academic discipline in the western Beaux Arts tradition. The narrative goes on to consider the importance of archaeological discoveries, particularly of the Archaemenid and Sassanian periods, on Iranian architecture, and the tension this set up between concepts of national identity and the influence of international modernism. These are explored through detailed discussion of such significant sites as Tehran's National Garden, the Parade Ground and the Ferdowsi Monument, of such authorities as Mohsen Foroughi and Houshang Seyhoun; and of the paralells between architecture in Iran and in the broader Middle East.


Niloofar Kakhi is an architect and researcher. She received her PhD in Histories and Theories of Architecture from the Architectural Association School of Architecture. 
Muhammad Abduh was an Egyptian jurist, theologian, philosopher, and a reformer of Al-Azhar. His impact on modern Islam was transformational. In fact, much of modern Muslim thought has either been a reaction for or against his ideas.

Science and Civilisation between Islam and Christianity is the first ever English translation of Abduh's al-Islam wa-l-Nasraniyya ma'a al-'Ilm wa-l-Madaniyya; a pivotal treaty in the study of Christian-Muslim relations. Up until now the text has largely been received as a piece of apology against Christianity, but this new translation challenges this perception by introducing the treaty as one of epistemology.

Muhammad Abduh (1849-1905) was a religious scholar, philosopher, jurist, and reformer, who led the late 19th-century movement in Egypt and other Muslim societies to revitalize Islamic teachings and institutions in the modern world.

Mohamed Gamal Abdelnour teaches at Al-Azhar University (Cairo) and a research fellow at the department of philosophy, University of York.

Umran Khan is an Arabic-English translator, editor and proofreader. He teaches Arabic and Islamic History at the Hounslow Jamia Masjid & Islamic Centre in London.

In addition to recounting the crucial international politics that drew fierce lines in the sands of the Middle East—a story of intrigue between the British, Russians, Ottomans, North Africans, Americans, and others—the contributors engage topics ranging from the war's effects on women, the experience of the Kurds, sectarianism, the evolution of Islamism, and the importance of prominent intellectuals like Ziya Gökalp and Michel 'Aflaq. They examine the dissolution of the Ottoman Empire, the exploitation of notions of Islamic unity and pan-Arabism, the influences of Woodrow Wilson and American ideals on Middle East leaders, and likewise the influence of Vladimir Lenin's vision of a communist utopia.

Altogether, they tell a story of promises made and promises broken, of the struggle between self-determination and international recognition, of centuries-old empires laying in ruin, and of the political poker of the twentieth century that carved up the region, separating communities into the artificial states we know today.

The history of Pahlavi Iran has traditionally been written as prologue to the 1979 Iranian Revolution and firmly located within a national historical context. However, the reign of the last Shah of Iran, Mohammad Reza Pahlavi (1941-1979), in fact marked the highpoint of Iran's global interconnectedness. Never before had Iranians felt the impact of global political, social, economic, and cultural forces so intimately in their national and daily lives, nor had Iranian actors played such an important global role, on battlefields, barricades, and in board rooms far beyond Iran's borders.

Engaging with a national historical narrative, *The Age of Aryamehr* writes Iran into the global history of the 1960s and 1970s, so as to understand the transnational connections that in many ways formed modern Iran.

Roham Alvandi is Associate Professor of International History and Director of the IDEAS Cold War Studies Project at the London School of Economics and Political Science (LSE). He is the author of *Nixon, Kissinger, and the Shah: The United States and Iran in the Cold War* (2014).
